Introducing the New MAX Board

Last month, we held elections for the new MAX board and are happy to announce our board is bigger and better than ever, full of enthusiasm and powered by a strong interest to take MAX to the next level.

The new MAX chairman is Tom Frank, who is a relatively new member of our group. Ironically, Tom and I met over ten years ago when he was a client of my company. ;-) A masterful marketer, he comes armed with years of experience in running similar boards and committees in the business, education and non-profit sectors. I'm confident his guidance will introduce fresh new ideas and a focus on "programming that works" for our members. As I step down as chairman, I'm taking the new role of MAX Chief Operating Officer, where I will work to maintain consistency as we move to new leadership, as well as help "keep the trains running on time" and troubleshooting as needed.

We welcome the following new board members. In addition to Tom as chairman, former MAX chairman Mike Barsul will be establishing a Palm Springs MAX House; Jim Cady takes over as Secretary from Paul Munro and will be helping us with our 2019 fundraiser (more on that later); Bruce Cecil (who's a teacher at my old high school alma mater Moreau!) will help Nicky Wade with our burgeoning events program, and Keith Sjhölm will be instrumental in our upcoming fundraiser.

Adding new board members will allow our existing MAX board members to focus on specific areas. Phil Walker will concentrate on Travel, Nicky Wade is taking over from Paul Munro as Programs and Events Chair, and Paul Munro will continue as Communications Chair. By contrast, Jason Feinberg will be expanding his focus from "First Friday" to include the upcoming fundraiser. Jerry Tusan will continue to lead "Second Sunday," Nicky Wade will continue to lead "Fourth at Finn," and Phil Carberry – who is leaving the board – will remain as coordinator of our "Third Thursdays" at Beaux and House Master for The Village House.

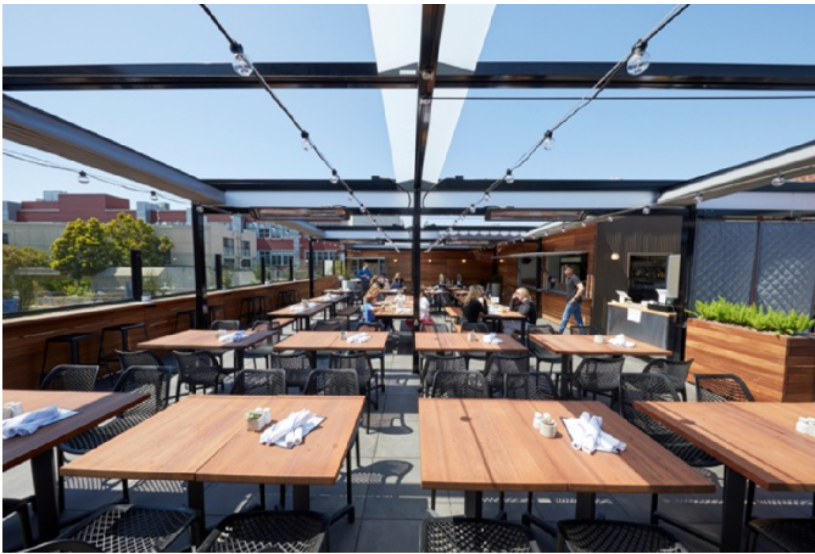
Expect lots more interesting news to come in the next several weeks as we expand our communications options for our members, as well as introduce some exciting new event initiatives.

MAX India: Delhi, Taj Mahal, Jaipur, and Udaipur March 28th-April 13th

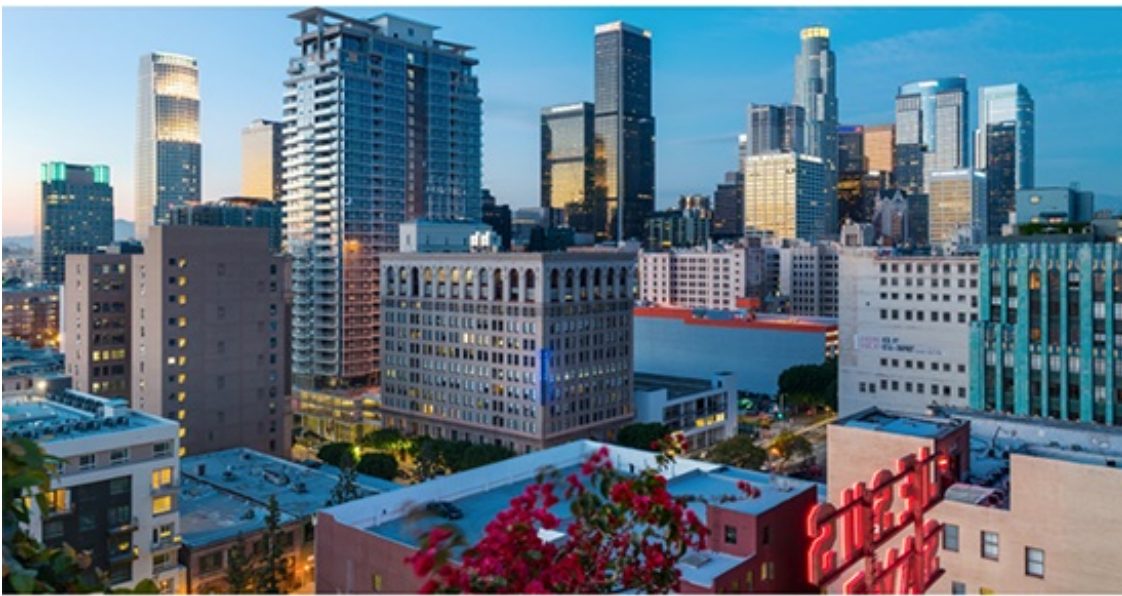
