### **First Friday at Beaux**

Come socialize with old friends and make some new friends at First Friday on **October 6th** at Beaux Bar, 2344 Market Street. The event goes from 5:30pm to 7:30 pm. There is no entry or cover charge for this event. Happy hour prices apply as mixed drinks are buy one, get one free until 7pm. We hope to see you there!

### **Guided Tour of Nike Missile Site**

**Saturday, October 7, 12pm-3pm** - Join event champions, Elie Abijaoude and Jim Tom for a fascinating guided tour of the Nike Missile Site SF 88 with an approximate 2 to 2.5 hour duration. Site is in the Marin Headlands in the Golden Gate National Recreation Area. A Nike Veteran will provide a special tour for MAX that will take us back in history to learn about the nuclear arm race and America's defense during the Cold War. As the Cold War heated up in the early 1950s, a sense of imminent danger and fear of Soviet nuclear attack entered Americans' daily lives. In response, the US Army constructed a nationwide system of almost 300 Nike missile sites with radar directed Nike missiles carrying nuclear warheads to meet incoming Soviet aircraft. The Site SF 88 is the only site to be restored and opened to the public.

Tour is accompanied with full narrative and stories of personal experiences of a Nike Cold War veteran. Tour includes seeing: a Nike Hercules Missile under assembly and near completion in the assembly room; the fueling station and assembly area for the Ajax Missile, the first Surface to Air guided missile; integrated fire control - missile and target tracking; security procedures; nuclear protocols; launch area and missile magazine with complete Nike Hercules Missiles, and; demonstration of launch positioning. The studios are opened from 11am - 5pm, but we will meet at 1:00 pm at 1890 Bryant Street in San Francisco. Every autumn, hundreds of San Francisco artists open their studios to the general public. They do it with a hope that people will want to purchase the art, but they are always happy to talk about their work. Most of the artists also put out beverages and snacks, to make it more enticing to come into their studios. This year, MAX will start by visiting the 1890 Bryant Street Studios, a unique industrial art complex with 100+ artists, for about an hour, then walk over to other nearby buildings that house art studios. 

### [Recap of Recent Events](#)

*Tour of SF Civic Center* - The MAX tour on September 14 about San Francisco's historic civic center was well-received. Led by Jim Haas, Esq., an authority on the City Beautiful movement and author of a book that details how San Francisco's civic center historic buildings were built, the talk ended with an informative tour of City Hall and special moment on the Mayor's balcony.



*Retrospective Art Show presented by Tom of Finland Foundation -*

On September 19, MAX and other social groups enjoyed socializing and viewing erotic and queer art at the home of Gary Keener. Gary hosted the Tom of Finland Foundation Artist-in-Residence, Felix D'eon, whose paintings were among the highlights in Gary's art collection.



*Angel Island Excursion* - MAX members explored Angel Island on September 23, which was a gorgeous day for our outdoor adventure. After a ferry ride from the SF Ferry Building, some MAXers hiked while others took a tram from the ferry arrival to the Angel Island Immigration Station. This station operated from 1910 – 1940 and was established to be the Ellis Island of the West. A primary goal was to enforce the Chinese Exclusion Act and thereby discourage and restrict immigration from China. The group enjoyed a fascinating tour of the detention barracks museum by an excellent volunteer docent, Joe, whom many considered to be "a cut above".

After touring the immigration center, MAX had a picnic lunch and enjoyed performances by a group of classical musicians and a German oompah band. After lunch, MAX took a guided tram tour around the perimeter of the entire island. Highlights included the military garrison established in 1863 during the Civil War, the ruins of Fort McDowell, and the remains of a NIKE Missile Site, where non-nuclear missiles were based during the Cold War to defend against Soviet Union bombers. Finally, the group hopped on the last ferry back to San Francisco.
